

Press Operator 1

Job summary

The Press Operator operates the headset and coldest Web Offset Printing presses with make-readies, runs press equipment operations, performs quality control functions, and enforces the safety rules.

This position is a leadership role and will assist in directing the work activities of the press crewmembers to ensure productivity, quality, and safety goals are met. This position also must have at least 5 years of experience on multi-web, four-color headset, and/or coldest presses and thorough knowledge of Web Press printing processes.

Responsibilities

Gives daily instructions to the Second Press Operator

Examines job tickets and gathers any information or instruction to produce a quality product in compliance with job specifications and timelines

Prepares press in an efficient and timely manner

Installs Plates and Blankets efficiently

Observes press operation to detect machine malfunctions

Examines printed copy, adjusts ink and water settings for ink density and accurate color match to proofing materials

Makes web alignment/compensator and registration adjustments for a proper position on paper

Helps manage paper waste to reasonable levels

Checks all skid tags and check off sheets for any missing information

Verifies quantities, bundle counts, turns, and proper stacking configuration

Communicates any pertinent information to the Second Press Operator on the following shift

Performs general press maintenance and makes minor repairs and adjustments to the equipment when needed

Job summary

The primary function of the Press Operator role is to operate production class color digital presses. Secondary functions are operating small format digital finishing equipment. The Press Operator will operate the presses efficiently and effectively to insure on-time delivery.

Responsibilities

Read and understand the production job ticket

Set up the digital device(s) based on the specifications of the job

Perform preventative maintenance and routine repairs

Pull stock inventory and record usage

Load and unload the digital device(s) with the specified substrate(s)

Merge electronic files using various software applications to the digital devices

Job summary

The Press Operator is responsible for setting up and converting finished parts and subassemblies in compliance with appropriate work instructions, procedures, and company practices.



Responsibilities

Sets up and runs converting press in compliance with work instructions and company procedures.

Performs maintenance on converting equipment according to the preventive maintenance schedule, and when otherwise required.

Completes necessary paperwork to document tasks performed.

Training and assisting with equipment maintenance, when scheduled and when otherwise required, as well as maintaining maintenance records.

Notifies the Quality Department of nonconforming material. Brings nonconformances, product quality issues, or other potential problems to the attention of the direct supervisor.

Has an understanding of the Labeling Control Procedure.

Performs visual inspections for defects.

Understanding of the Quality Policy and ISO Awareness.

Has an understanding of the requirements to control customer property.

Maintains product identification and traceability.

Responsible for cleaning and maintaining the work area.

Follows the instruction, guidelines, and specifications in the Process Instruction Manual.

Follows the Lockout/Tagout procedure and ensure safe Lockout/Tagout practices when needed.

Press Operator 4

Job summary

The Press Operator controls the operation of receiving treated material, and board, controlling the press cure cycle, panel grading, and plate changes. Performs other tasks as needed.



Responsibilities

Operates press to cure the material according to the press cycle specifications

Evaluates the daily press schedule.

Logs production information such as material produced, type, size, run, control settings, etc.

Ensures all material is present for the production process.

Lays up and aligns the raw materials according to the production process.

Handles the movement of stainless steel plates, and completed panels.

Initiates corrective action if production operations are not to standard.

Trains personnel on the performance of tasks.

Performs lock-out/tag-out procedures and preventative maintenance checks.

Ensures employees are wearing protective equipment as required or when handling hazardous materials.

Package finished materials according to standard procedures.

Requirements

Knowledge of safety standards applicable to the work area and other pertinent rules/regulations governing work standards.

Knowledge of the pressing manufacturing process and component materials utilized.

Press Operator 10

Job summary

We are looking for a Press Operator to join our team.

Responsibilities

Verifies size, color, and type of paper and color of ink from job order. Cleans inking rolls with solvent, using protective gloves, and replaces them in the press using hand tools. Loads ink fountains with new colors required for the job.

Adjusts controls to regulate the volume of ink. Packs impression cylinder with appropriate materials.

Adjusts take-off tapes and positions and locks form on the cylinder of the press.

Directs press feeder or assistant in the adjustment of feed guides, grippers, and elevators.

Starts press and runs off proof sheets, examining proofs to determine off-level areas, variations in ink volume, register slippage, indications of offsetting, and color register. Adjusts press controls, ink fountains, and automatic feeders and repacks cylinders with an overlay to equalize off-level areas.

Operates cylinder press with cutting attachments to cut or shape paper or paperboard.

Inspects product regularly during the press run and adjusts settings and ink viscosity or shuts down press and makes adjustments.

Troubleshoots quality problems and finds answers or seeks help from a supervisor.

Makes repairs on equipment, replacing worn or damaged parts. Assists department mechanics in making major repairs and overhauls.

Keeps count of completed product on each run and records and disposes of spoilage to the paper baler. Posts production delays and their causes.
